"Primitive Range" and a few other thoughts....

My friend Kit Cessna was able to stop by and visit my range on his way back from a Midland Sniper course he instructed. He liked what he saw when we went over the facility and commented that there is much to be appreciated about a "primitive" range. Meaning that that simplicity coupled with proper training techniques is the key. I agreed with him.

I constructed the ranges with all weather parking so you can take a few steps from your vehicle and be under overhead cover. Other than that, they are simple and basic. They key is how you train to use what you have. You don't need fancy polished ranges, but rather a range that compliments your system. What you need is a place you can train hard and get dirty under best and worse case conditions.

Potential students ask me what is important. I reply that having a simple, efficient and proven that is easy to train with, is important. As is important is that you understand how to train and that you maximize your training time and effort.

My goal as an instructor is to seek out students who want realistic shooting and tactical training. I made a decision long ago not to become a prostitute and sell a former career or incident to make money, but rather to build and improve on a solid foundation of tactical shooting, while keeping an open mind to new techniques and developments.

Currently my law enforcement classes are my mainstay, but I will slowly start moving into the civilian market. I will not go with the high-profile route but would rather stick with the word of mouth approach. It has worked for me in the LE arena and I have been able to keep busy with this system. I feel that as long as I can stay humble and put out a superior product, the right individuals will see out the training.

My goal in this time of my life is to help develop safe and effective shooters in both the law enforcement and civilian community. I try to push as much knowledge as the individual can safely handle and then let them go out on their own to train and develop their skills. When they are ready for the next step, they can come back for more. For new shooters, I will provide a safe and structured program that you can go far with and build upon. As does any quality instructor, I try to cut the "fluff" out and let you know what I think is important and works and what is a gimmick.

COURSE UPDATE(S):

Assault Breaching Course:

The Assault Breaching Course in the Chicago area was another great trip. I had a great class for both the Shotgun Breaching and the Assault Breaching class. We had an old three-story building that was built way back when. It had great old doors, window glass and glass block to work on.
