
## U.S. Has Spent \$3.7 Trillion On Welfare Over Past 5 Years




Senate Budget Committee Ranking Member Jeff Sessions' Republican staff calculation of OMB data. Education figure excludes the unannounced liquidation of such spending.





## **EQUIPMENT:**

### **My View of Weapon Cleaning and Lubrication:**

I am sorry to report, that I have not found one cure all weapon cleaning and lubrication product in one. Here is my take on what is out there.

#### **Cleaner**

Cleaning your weapon is a two stage process. I flush it out with Carburetor cleaner and then go after powder fouling in the barrel along with copper. Carb cleaner is cheap, readily available and gets into all recesses of the weapon. Gun scrubber is 3-4 times the cost.

#### **Barrel Cleaners**

I have been using a product called "Wipe Out" on all my barrels. It is a foam that will first attack the powder fouling and if left long enough, will eat away the copper. It is non-toxic and that is a plus.

If you want to leave the copper in and just get the fouling, try Hoppes.

#### **Lubricants**

I have tried a bunch of lubricants over the years and here are my thoughts. For our large classes, we use Automatic Transmission Fluid in spray bottles to keep the cost down. It works well and the guns have no issues with it.

I like all the new non-toxic/green lubes out there, but some have a shelf-life of a couple of years. If it only works for a couple of years, then what will it do on a gun in long term storage such as your gun safe?

Some lubes are heavier than other, some lighter. Some are two-stage, which means you have to shake it before application. If it separates in the bottle, will it separate in the gun or will it migrate from the area you put in on?

I have gone back to Mil-Comm Products for my general lubrication. If I have load bearing surfaces I want to treat, I use TW-25 paste/grease. I also use it in barrels for long term storage. I use TW-2500 spray for most of moving parts.

Another lube that looks extremely promising is Wilson's gun lubes. The oil is a bit thicker and tends to cling where it is applied. It is similar to lubes used to protect race car engines that are put on a shelf for months.

I have used FireClean as a cleaner and it does especially well with suppressors and but I have gone to a heavier lube for the lubrication phase of weapon cleaning.

### **CLASSROOM/ LODGE:**

We officially have a Pro Shop in the gun shop area. Several local LE officers have formed a small business and are stocking common items students have requested over the years to include hearing protection, T-Shirts, hats, knives, etc.
